

WORDS OF WISDON FROM PASTOR KIM

Come Home to Bethlehem; Come Home to God

The theme of going home, or homecoming, seems especially relevant at this time of year. Our culture idealizes Christmas in a secular sense, and at the center of that idealization is the longing to be home with family. Some of our most popular carols express this sentiment. "I'll be home for Christmas; you can count on me," one proclaims. Another gives the same message: "Oh, there's no place like home for the holidays." These songs remind us that Christmas is a time to go home. And over the coming weeks, millions of people all across the country will be loading into planes, trains, and automobiles to head home for Christmas.

And if you are familiar with the scripture passages proclaiming Christ's birth, you may remember that the first Christmas was literally an occasion for people to come home. Luke's gospel explains that because of the command from the Roman emperor, Joseph and Mary were required to go back to their hometown of Bethlehem to register for the census. And once Jesus was born there, God sent out an invitation for all the world to come home, to come home to the child in the manger. That word of invitation began with the shepherds out in the moon-lit fields. The angel came to them and said, in so many words, "Come home to Bethlehem." And later on, as learned wise men peered at the night sky, the very stars spoke to them, saying, "Come home. Come home and meet your King." When Jesus was born in Bethlehem and was laid in the manger, all the world was invited to come home for Christmas.

It seems to me that's an invitation we desperately want and need to hear. As a nation, we've become such nomads that we aren't that different from the shepherds in the Christmas story. Just like those shepherds, many of us don't have a place where we feel a deep sense of belonging. The reality of modern times is that we don't for the most part make deep connections with one another, at least outside of our family and social circles. If we stay in touch with people outside of those circles, it's often through technology. While technology has enabled us to stay in touch with a larger group of people, it's often at a more superficial level.

In addition, recent events in our country and world have stirred up even more fears of strife and violence, contributing to a sense of darkness around us. Into such a world, God comes and Christ is born, offering us NOT the promise of a perfect world but the hope that God will be with us in whatever we face.

And so the Christmas message of "Come Home" should be a welcome one for just about all of us. Each of us has a different understanding of what home means but all of us have a need for a place of belonging. I remember a number of years ago when I was going through a difficult time and an older and wiser friend and mentor said simply, "Home is being with the people who love you." Indeed it is. And that is what makes Christmas so special and its meaning so personal and universal at one and the same time.

This is the season in which to listen for heavenly angels winging across the sky. A season in which to look for stars up above, through the cold air, beaming to all the world an invitation. Together they join in saying, "Come home to Christmas. Come home to your Savior. All is forgiven. You are cherished. You are loved as you are." Who among us would turn away from that message? Coming home to God is coming home to ourselves. It is coming home to the only place and person who can offer us a home no matter where we live and even beyond our lifetime.

I invite you to come home to be with your church family this Advent season as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior. We have special features of our Advent worship services, as well as numerous ministry/fellowship events planned this month. Please review the calendar and this newsletter for a detailed description of all that is planned.

And plan now to be with us on Christmas Eve for our worship opportunities. We will have a 5 pm and a 7:30 pm service. At 5 pm, we will offer a Candlelight service with carols, special music and a Children's Message. At 7:30 p.m., we will gather for a traditional candlelight service with special music, carols, and a Christmas Eve message. I look forward to joining you at our church home and with our church family on this very special night.

We are so happy they have chosen us to be their church family and we look forward to baptizing Joanna in the coming months.




The United Methodist Church Book Club meets the 3rd Tuesday of each month.

A team of volunteers has been hard at work planning the details for our new Baby/Toddler Clothing Ministry. Our target date to open the doors of the ministry will be early March.


