WORDS OF WISDOM FROM PASTOR KIM

"WHY WE COUNT ON CHRISTMAS"

Did you ever notice that the Christmas story as told in the scriptures begins not with the voice of God or the songs of angels, but with the order of an emperor? Emperor Augustus orders everyone to register at the town of his or her birth in order to be counted in the census. That means that Joseph and Mary, who live in Nazareth, must travel to Bethlehem. The Bible doesn't tell us anything about their journey, but we can probably imagine the physical discomfort of Mary, and the frustration she and Joseph shared at being forced to obey an emperor at the cost of endangering their baby. When they finally arrived at Bethlehem, so many people were there for the census that all the inns were full. How ironic it was that when Mary and Joseph went to Bethlehem to be counted, there is no place for them and Mary is forced to give birth in a stable intended for animals. The fact that Mary and Joseph had traveled for more than 200 miles and that she was in the early stages of labor didn't count for anything. Mary and Joseph went to be counted, but they were treated as if they didn't count at all.

All that counted for Emperor Augustus was Roman control, not human rights. And Mary and Joseph weren't even at the bottom of the social and economic ladder. The shepherds were so low on that ladder that they didn't even have to show up for the census. The shepherds were the Roman Emperor's undocumented workers and were denied any legal rights. All they counted for was counting sheep. Beyond that, they simply didn't count.

Although Emperor Augustus has the first word in the Christmas story, he does not have the last word. Someone else was traveling with Mary and Joseph on the road from Nazareth to Bethlehem. How did they ever manage that difficult journey? They managed because, as the angel Gabriel said to Mary in the very beginning, with God anything is possible. God was with them throughout their journey, bound to Mary with a cord of love.

How do we manage to keep on going on a sometimes rough and painful journey, when sin has invaded our world and is doing its best to make us feel that our efforts for good don't count? By the end of the Christmas story, we see that those who counted for little or nothing in the eyes of the world—Mary, Joseph, and the humble shepherds—counted for everything in the eyes of God. For to them a child was born, to them a Son was given—and not just given to them, but the Christmas promise is that the child is also given to us.

And so we celebrate at Christmas because God is with us, too, when the road is hard and bumpy. God is here, hidden in the curves and turns of our lives, bound to us with a cord of love that nothing can sever.

In the end the powers of darkness will not count. We are inheritors of a particular kind of wealth the wealth of a God whose love will not let us go; hope that will not let us down; life that will not let us die. The One who has counted every hair on our head is on the road with us this Christmas and always, no matter the bumps we face. We celebrate this Christmas because we can count on that.

Please join us this Christmas Eve as we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior. We hope to see you each Sunday in Advent. Because Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year, our Music and Worship Committee has decided to do something a little differently. We will have joyful worship on Christmas Eve morning at our usual worship time of 10:30am. Then later in the day, we will have one joint Christmas Eve Service of Carols and Candlelight at 5:30pm on December 24. The joint service will feature a Christmas Eve Children's Message, Special Music, and Carols and Candlelight. We look forward to having you worship with us at this most holy time of year.


