SELECT YOUR FAVORITE CHRISTMAS CAROL.... WRITE A DEVOTION

In the week before Christmas, we would love to send out a devotion on a beloved Christmas carol to each of our members. Therefore, I am inviting anyone who is interested to select your favorite carol, write a brief devotion, and email it back to the church no later than Tuesday, December 15.

A devotion is simple and anyone can write one. Here is what you do: Name your favorite carol, then write a paragraph or two saying why you like the carol, how it speaks to you, and what you think it is saying spiritually. You can then end your devotion with a one or two sentence prayer. We will then email one out each day in the days leading up to Christmas. This will only work if at least seven of you agree....so folks I am counting on seven of you to write a devotion.

Here is one I offer you as an example, which I wrote.

Hymn: In the Bleak Midwinter

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan, earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, in the bleak midwinter, long ago.

Our God, heaven cannot hold him, nor earth sustain; heaven and earth shall flee away when he comes to reign. In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed the Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ.

Angels and archangels may have gathered there, cherubim and seraphim thronged the air; but his mother only, in her maiden bliss, worshiped the beloved with a kiss.

What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; if I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; yet what I can I give him: give my heart.

Devotion:

A friend from a church I served in Norwalk never failed to tell me each year how much she loved this carol. It was her all- time favorite. Since it is not a carol that people typically call a favorite, I was curious why she liked it so much. She told me that she loved the meditative tune of the carol but especially the imagery: the contrast of the cold, dark, dreary days of winter with the hope and light of the good news of the birth of Christ. That contrast was compelling to her. Her interest in this carol made me want to take a closer look at t. I found myself drawn to verse 4: *"What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were shepherd, I would bring a lamb. If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; yet what can I give him: give my heart."*

These words are very meaningful in that they remind us that Jesus deserves the best we have to offer. And that everyone from the lowly shepherds to the wise kings know to make themselves humble before God. But even more important, on days when we feel we don't have much to offer, we can always offer the most important thing: the gift of our heart, our love. And that is what Jesus wants the most. And it is the most priceless gift we have to offer.

Prayer:

Dear God, We are made humble in the face of all that you offer us. Help us give your son the most important thing we have to offer this Christmas: the gift of our heart, holding nothing back. **Amen.**

He built a walkway to the garden, stained the existing bench and cross and built extra benches for seating. The prayer labyrinth is made of bricks and is meant to be a quiet place to walk and meditate and pray.

Here are some instructions on how to walk through a labyrinth: Open your senses and focus on the process of taking slow and deliberate steps. Bring to mind a **prayer** or spiritual question to contemplate during the **walk** to the center. Reaching the center, pause to reflect, **pray**, and listen for an answer or for deeper revelation. Now begin the return journey.

Our labyrinth will also be added to the worldwide labyrinth finder, so others in the area may be able to find it and use it for their own spiritual needs and prayer.

TRASH PICK UP SUSPENDED THROUGH MID-FEBRUARY


