

WORDS OF WISDOM FROM PASTOR KIM

Spiritual Exam Time

Dear friends,

I always think of Lent as a church season which offers us the opportunity for a spiritual self- exam. Lent starts with Ash Wednesday, which is February 14, this year. Each year on the first Sunday in Lent, which this year is February 18, we read in the scriptures about how Jesus had to face a 40-day "wilderness exam" to see if he could overcome the temptations Satan threw at him. At the end of this time of testing, he knew he was ready to move forward with his ministry.

A good place to begin our own Lenten "wilderness exam" is with the traditional Wesleyan question: "How goes it with your soul?"

John Wesley, an Episcopal priest in England in the 1700's who founded United Methodism, coined the question: "How goes it with your soul?"

When he was a student at Oxford University, he organized several "holy clubs" in which Christians would regularly meet to ask themselves and each other this question on a regular basis. If we honestly face this question, we will certainly fall short in our own self-assessment. But it's important to face the question anyway. Indeed, it's important to ask it of ourselves over and over again. The season of Lent is an opportune time to name those areas in which we need to grow and to begin to give those areas our full attention.

And so friends, how goes it with your soul? During this season of Lent, make time each day to consider this question. Here are some other spiritual disciplines that I would prayerfully ask you to consider during this upcoming holy season:

- Make weekly worship attendance a priority.
- ♦ Give serious consideration to participating in our Lenten study group, "Made for a Miracle: From Your Ordinary to God's Extraordinary", beginning Thursday, February 15, at 7:00pm and continuing for six weeks.
- ♦ When I was a kid growing up in the Catholic church, we used to give something up for Lent. Instead of giving something up, consider taking something on, such as daily prayer time of 30 minutes (or less if you are new to prayer time and find 30 minutes an overwhelming thought).

During Lent may we hear God's call to repentance and spiritual self-examination even as we hear God's promise to forgive us and love us eternally.



Dear Pastors, Administrative Board Chairs, Finance Chairs, and Treasurers,

I would like to take this opportunity to say "thanks" for your tremendous commitment in honoring the work of our connectional church. As a former church treasurer, finance chair and stewardship chair I am keenly aware of what it means for a church to pay their conference apportionments. It is not a trivial accomplishment, especially in what have been challenging economic times. We ended the 2017 year collecting 90% of all apportionments, which is three percentage points above last year! This is the highest collection rate in the past ten years. Please note that this does not mean that your church did not pay 100%. For those that did, Faithful in Ministry certificates will be given to your District Superintendent to present to your church at your next Charge Conference.

Conference apportionments can sometimes be perceived as a tax or funding of purely administrative costs. But the reality is that apportionments fund healthcare for our retired clergy, community outreach programs such as food kitchens and warming shelters, our Archives and Parish Development activities and the global missions of our denomination in addition to many other areas.

Approximately 25% of all apportionment dollars sent to the Conference are re-directed to the general church to support the seven funds listed below.

- World Service Fund
- Ministerial Education Fund
- Episcopal Fund
- Black College Fund
- General Administration Fund
- Africa University Fund
- Interdenominational Cooperation Fund

Should you have any questions about how apportionments work or how these funds carry out the mission of the denomination, please refer to the attached slides.

Again, I want to thank all of you who have paid your 2017 apportionments whether partially or in full. I hope you will agree that it is money well spent.

THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF DANBURY HAS INSTALLED A NEW SOFTWARE SYSTEM FOR TRACKING MEMBERSHIP CALLED BREEZE.

The **BREEZE** software allows our congregation to view and update their own personal membership data. It also allows you to view your family giving history online.

All adult church members will be given the option to register for this access via an email registration process. If you would like to be able to update/view your membership records for your family as well as your family giving history, please follow the registration instructions in the email you will receive from **BREEZE**. You will only have access to your families information.

One of the major goals in obtaining this new software is to improve our membership records. We expect you may find inaccurate, old or missing information in your membership records. Please update your membership information. This will enable us to help keep our membership records up to date and accurate.

The gray headings on the **BREEZE** screen will display (like below) "Main" "Contact". If you move your mouse over these headings you will see a "Edit" link pop up that will allow you to update your family records. Each Adult - "Head of Household" will be given edit access to the entire set of your family records (e.g. spouse, children).

Who doesn't like to receive a Valentine and it is a nice way to send them our love and good wishes.






The United Methodist Church Book Club meets the 3rd Tuesday of each month.




