WORDS OF WISDOM FROM PASTOR KIM

General Conference: The Way Forward

From February 23-26, there is a Special Session of general Conference of the United Methodist Church, meeting in St. Louis, for the purpose of determining what the language of our Book of Discipline shall be re: the full inclusion or lack thereof of LGBT persons. Currently, our Book of Discipline forbids the performing of same gender weddings in our churches or by our clergy. It also forbids the ordination of "self-avowed, practicing homosexuals."

Three proposals are currently before the General Conference for consideration at the session:

- 1. The One Church Plan: Would remove the restrictive language in the Discipline but add language that protects a congregation or annual conference if it chooses to not allow same gender weddings or the ordination of gay candidates. In essence, each annual conference would decide for itself how it wants to proceed re: these issues, with individual congregations or clergy retaining the freedom to make their own choices.
- The Connectional Conference Plan: Would necessitate every church and every conference choosing if it wishes to be part of newly constructed conference areas that would be progressive, traditional, or contextual.
- 3. **The Traditionalist Plan:** Would keep the restrictive language of the Discipline and also add punishments for bishops, pastors and Boards of Ordained Ministry who do not adhere to the Discipline.

(Though The UMC Judicial Council in October ruled most of the proposed punitive measures as unconstitutional).

The Council of Bishops has moved to support the One Church Plan, believing it is our best hope for keeping the denomination together.

At the district gathering at our church November 27, at which Bishop Bickerton addressed clergy and laity present, it was clear from a straw poll that a vast majority of the 100 + persons present, also supported the One Church Plan. It was also highlighted that any of the above plans could be amended to the point where they no longer resemble the current plans.

It is also possible that the General Conference will end up doing nothing to change the status quo.

Bishop Bickerton has asked that every United Methodist take 3 minutes of every day between 2:23pm and 2:26pm (representing the dates of the Special Session) to be in prayer for the work of the upcoming Conference and for our denomination as a whole.

This Sunday, February 3, I will remain after worship to answer questions to the best of my ability that individuals might have about the three plans being proposed and how they might affect the denomination. The purpose of this is to address questions only - no extensive discussion and no debate will be held.






The United Methodist Church Book Club meets the 3rd Tuesday of each month.




DANBURY APPALACHIA SERVICE PROJECT MEXICAN FIESTA
