

WORDS OF WISDOM FROM PASTOR KIM

One of the great things about being a pastor is that sometimes you get to witness dramatic change in people. Most of us change and grow in incremental ways and that is wonderful. But I'm talking about the person who is plodding along in life, minding their own business, keeping their head down, trying to keep it all low key, when somehow God reaches in, grabs them, shakes them up, and they, despite themselves, are different as a result.

But as people who celebrate Easter, should we really be surprised? A God who would raise someone from the dead after three days in the tomb is just the sort of God who wouldn't mind shaking up folks who like everything nice and quiet. I think immediately of the late Christian writer CS Lewis who spoke of his life before his conversion as that "time before God closed in on me." He writes of the experience of being converted by God as a moment when we was "surprised by joy."

Most of us experience the Christian life as a process or progression: attend church, develop our faith, attend Bible studies, follow spiritual disciplines, take on a leadership role, etc. But sometimes, by the sheer surprising grace of God, someone gets grabbed; God closes in, claims, calls, converts, kind of like Saul (St. Paul) on the Damascus Rd. Remember Saul, Church Enemy Number 1, persecutor of the church? He was struck down on the Damascus Rd., blinded by the light, made humble by the vision of Christ that he saw. He went on to become St. Paul, great missionary to the Gentiles, church planter, and writer of all those letters we find in the second half of our New Testament.

We are just two weeks away from Easter, that wondrous day when we will again celebrate the stone being rolled away from the tomb and the risen Christ bursting the bonds of death. Are our lives any different because of Easter? How could they not be? Jesus is raised from the dead, brought from death to life, after all. A gift to us: grace and salvation and love.



Most of us don't really like to change. And yet deep in our hearts we need the story of Easter to heal our lives, to heal the world. We may not like to be lurched and jolted, but we long for something more and so we resonate with the story of a man who got knocked down, blinded by the light on the Damascus Rd., a story that challenges all characterizations of the Christian life as a continuous progression from point A to point B with no jerks or jolts along the way. But sometimes, by the grace of God, while we're on our way, suddenly a light surprises, God gets to us, grabs us, blinds us, and we DO change.

And I pray that we will let ourselves BE changed by Jesus Christ who gave it all for you and me. Just like John Wesley whose heart was strangely warmed by a conversion experience at a worship service; just like CS Lewis who was surprised by joy; just like Saul who was blinded and then made whole on the Damascus Rd.; just like every person who is willing to let his or her life be turned around by a God who wakes the sleeping and raises the dead.

May the beauty of spring and all it's awakenings fill your heart with joy.




The United Methodist Church Book Club meets the 3rd Tuesday of each month.


1st Quarter (Q1) 2017 Financial Update


Danbury UMC closed the Q1 2017 with quarterly income of \$45.9K and expenses of \$52.9K for the operating budget. This represents a Q1 net loss of \$6.9K. Q1 is always our most challenging quarter with the high winter bills (electric, oil, etc) and we typically run a deficit but this is ~\$5K worse than we experienced in Q1 of 2016.

The immediate impact of this is that we are very tight on being able to pay our bills week to week. With this it is very important that everyone try to keep up with pledging on a timely basis.

We need to be able to keep current with our bills and obligations. Thank you!

Below are reports that show our Income and Expenses for Q1 2017, compared to Q1 2016. The drop in income (\$11.8K decline year over year) is the driver of the decline in year to year profit (loss). Expenses year over year for Q1 were \$6.9K less in 2017 than 2016. Note: Part of the reason for the drop in income and expenses year to year is due to heavy roof fund raising and expenses in Q1 2016. Below is a chart that shows the major expense categories for Q1 2017.

We estimate we saved \$2,000 on electric bills by using the down stairs again this year. Thank you all that helped and supported this effort again this year! However, due to an increased use of fellowship hall and some facility users leaving heat on the total electric bill went up year to year by \$1,900. The Trustees have been and will continue to work on options to address this.

The detailed YTD reports will be posted outside of the office on the board.

CAN YOU SPARE ONE HOUR EVERY 6 WEEKS? THE ALTAR GUILD NEEDS YOU

Serve the Lord and Our Church - Join us Now!

The Altar Guild Schedule is created once a year from April through March of the following year. Fifty church members are currently serving on the Altar Guild. Each week a "Head of the Week" serves with you and provides training and guidance - you are never alone! The Head of the Week is either the chairperson or one of the assistants. An email reminder is sent to you the week you are scheduled to serve. The Altar Guild committees are set up so that you only have to serve once every six weeks.

Here are the Altar Guild Committees and a description of their duties.

Saturday Committee: One person and the "Head of the Week" prepare the sanctuary for Sunday Worship. Flowers are arranged, altar area is dusted, oil candles filled, hymn boards are changed. In addition, appropriate items are placed on the Altar.

Sunday Committee: One person stays after church and assists the Head of the Week. They put away all items used in the sanctuary during worship.

Homebound Delivery Service: One person takes flowers to a homebound member and visits with them. Easter and Christmas are the busiest times. This is a very special ministry.

Communion Committee: Two people arrive early on Communion Sunday to set everything in place for the communion service. They also stay a few minutes after worship to clean and store the communion ware.

Bread Bakers: One person bakes a loaf of bread or provides pita bread for Communion Sunday. Communion Sunday is the first Sunday of each month. In addition bread may also be needed for special worship services.

Communion Cushions: Two people arrive early to take the cushions out of storage and place them around the altar railing. After worship they remove and store the cushions.

Communion Ushers: Four people bring the communion elements to the altar and usher the congregation during Communion.

Seamstresses: Sew new altar cloths, keep all altar linens in good repair, sew covers for various altar items, create banners and assist with any miscellaneous sewing as needed.


Supporters: Gentlemen who usually serve at Easter and Christmas when muscle power is needed to set up tables and risers for our flowers as well as setting up the Christmas Tree.

Serving on the Altar Guild is an ideal way to serve without making a heavy commitment. It brings a great deal of satisfaction to those who serve, knowing they have played an essential part in the preparation of worship.
