Message from Pastor Kim

The Top Ten Reasons I Love the Church Season of Pentecost

- 10) Pentecost is unexpected and spontaneous. We don't have to plan for it or make it happens. It happens of its own accord.
- 9) The color for Pentecost is red--representing the "tongues of fire" that came to rest on each disciple (according to Acts 2:1-21) when the Holy Spirit visited that day. As such, the cross and flame symbol of United Methodism is an ongoing visual reminder of the meaning of Pentecost.
- 8) Of the 3 major church holidays--Easter, Christmas and Pentecost--only Pentecost has not been commercialized in our culture, thereby allowing us to focus exclusively on its spiritual dimensions.
- 7) Because the day of Pentecost was when the disciples first received the gift of the Spirit, emboldening them to baptize several thousand people, it is widely understood to be the birthday of the church. And birthdays are occasions for celebrations. Happy birthday, Christian Church!
- 6) The only "present" you are asked to give the church on its birthday is your "presence."
- 5) For number 5, you get to add YOUR reason for loving the season of Pentecost. If one doesn't come to mind, pray about it.
- 4) Pentecost never goes out of style. Because it is about being open to the leanings of the Spirit, its message lives on in each of our lives as long as WE are open to the leanings of the Spirit.
- 3) On the day of Pentecost, everyone present understood the message proclaimed in his or her own language. There were no barriers to God's Spirit. The message is clear that God's vision for the church is unity.
- 2) At Pentecost, the Word became flesh in the birth of a new community that would be called the Christian church. We, the Church, become the resurrected body of Christ in the world. Amazing!

1) Pentecost has once again come upon us to remind us that God is always doing a new thing, even if we are stuck in the "old thing." Praise God for fresh opportunities and new experiences! **Blessings In Christ, Pastor Kim**

Pastor Kim's surgery will take place on May 28 at the Hospital for Special Surgery in NYC. Please keep both she and her surgical team in your prayers on Thursday. She anticipates being in the hospital for 3 days, followed by 6 days at rehab.

Good morning. My name is Karlene Lombardo. I am the leader of the UMW at this church. We're not the United Mine Workers. Although we are not afraid to get our hands dirty for mission work! We are definitely not an exclusive club. There is no secret handshake. We are the United Methodist Women. We are part of a national organization that is currently 800,000 members strong. Our meetings and activities are open to all women. We have four quarterly meetings a year. All women can come and enjoy our events without feeling they are making a time consuming commitment. The meetings are advertised in the Flame and in our bulletins well in advance. Our spring and fall meetings are more structured with a speaker or some other special programming. Our meetings in December and June tend to focus on the fellowship aspects of this group. We like to have fun! The size of the gatherings ranges from thirteen to twenty-four woman in attendance. We also prepare and lead the Children's Sabbath (sponsored by the Children's Defense Fund) during worship on the third Sunday in October.

A few Sundays ago I held up our recognition certificate from 2014. I shared that our unit had received our 23rd year 5 Star recognition. This means that for twenty-three years we have given to the five undesignated areas of mission (Through the Women's Division of the United Methodist Church). They are: Pledge to Mission; Gift to Mission; Gift in Memory; World Thank Offering and Special Membership Recognition (Aasta Moser Award). We have already completed two of the stars and the rest will be done by October.

We are primarily a women's fellowship group that is dedicated to mission. We support mission projects in our church, in our community and beyond. Please note the missions that we have been supporting as you visit the UMW Mother's Day Bake Sale, in the Narthex, after church today. Thank you for your support.

The next United Methodist Women's meeting is Tuesday, June 2nd, at 6PM at my home at 70 Old Ridgebury Road in Danbury. It will be a cookout....Always fun, and we will have some men attending: Don, Larry and Paul will be our "Master Grillers". I hope to see you there! The best contacts for this organization are Minnie Rouse, Valerie Stagen and me.

Beyond what I have already said the organization of the United Methodist Women does have a Purpose. It reads:

The organized unit of the United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose PUR-POSE is to know GOD, and to experience freedom as whole persons through JESUS CHRIST; To develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.
