
Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

## FROM THE TRUSTEES

While I am sure we don't have to remind the members of our church that we are experiencing tight financial times, the Trustees Committee has a list of projects at the church and parsonage that need attention. Some of the needs are immediate, while others will be needing attention in the near future.

Some of things on the list are: new carpeting for the sanctuary, a new water heater for the church and a new roof for the parsonage. Significant funds from the Trustee savings account were utilized for the beam replacement project.

The Trustees Committee is currently researching selling two acres of church property that we are not using. We are having the property surveyed. Then it will be appraised and a realtor will be retained.

We have been in touch with the District Superintendent and should we decide to move forward, it will require a vote by our church members. If at that point we decide to sell the property and it is approved by our conference officials, the proceeds from the sale will be put into our savings account for needed capital projects for our church and parsonage. The funds will not be utilized for our general expense fund.
