MUSIC MINISTRY CELEBRATION


Please join us this Sunday, September 30, as we celebrate the music ministry of Associate Music Director Carol Spaulding and Barbara Kunicki.



STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity

One of Jesus' great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).



In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a

never-ending pursuit, Jesus' parable remains incredibly relevant. Many of us are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God intended for us.

All of us have struggled with these issues at one time or another. They are important issues that we cannot ignore. This is why for Our Stewardship Campaign beginning October 7, 2018 we will be having a study and worship emphasis called Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity. During this time we will explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management through corporate worship and small group study. We'll hear stories about what others have learned by working through financial challenges.

Our stewardship campaign will start Sunday October 7, 2018 and run the following 3 Sundays, ending with consecration Sunday October 28, 2018. At the conclusion of the emphasis, we will have the opportunity to make personal commitments of our offerings (our pledge) to God through our church in the coming year. We will consecrate these commitments in the worship service on Sunday October 28, 2018 in which Reverend Betsy Ott, our District Superintendent, will be our guest speaker and we will have a celebration lunch in fellowship hall.

I hope you will join us in the coming weeks as we look at how we can manage our financial resources and truly experience simplicity, generosity, and joy.



Rev. Betsy Ott will also be in worship with us and will offer the message.




SATURDAY, OCTOBER 6 10:00am - 4:00pm






The United Methodist Church Book Club meets the 3rd Tuesday of each month.


