

WORDS OF WISDOM FROM PASTOR KIM

Dear friends,

Greetings in the name of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I hope that each and every one of you is enjoying a restful summer.

I am back to work this week, and just wanted you to know I am looking forward to seeing you and to our continued ministry. I am grateful to you as a congregation for respecting my time away and wanted to let you know something of how I spent the last 10 weeks.

As I indicated prior to leaving, I had planned 4 five day retreats away, for the purpose of Christian meditation, reading, prayer and reflection. I was able to do these as planned and I looked forward to each one and found them renewing and uplifting.

I also spent an additional 10 days on the coast of Maine, visiting friends, reading, and enjoying spectacular sunsets and fresh seafood.

Two things happened that I had not planned for. A good friend of mine from upstate NY had what turned out to be a minor stroke, and I was able to visit and assist her for the better part of a week. She is now doing very well and is pretty much back to normal. I was very grateful to be free to go and spend some time with her.

The second unexpected thing was a lot more mundane, but took some time to suddenly prepare for: Honda of Danbury called and offered to buy me out of my car lease 10 months early. Because I projected that I would be over my mileage allotment, I jumped at the chance. So after having cleaned out my other car and spent what felt like hours dealing with the mounds of paperwork over at the dealer, I am driving a new car for the same monthly fee as my old one.

Probably a little over half of the time was spent at home at the parsonage. During these times at home, I continued my program of reading and meditating but also tackled a few projects that I never seem to get to: cleaning out a pantry, organizing upstairs closets and bureaus, and I started the project of organizing over 20 years worth of photographs (mostly nature photography, one of my hobbies).

During the time away, I read at least one book a week: some light fiction, some theological reading, a few memoirs, some serous fiction. Ever since I was a kid, reading has always felt like a very renewing and relaxing activity. Having that kind of time to just read was a real treat.

In the middle of all of this, in mid-June, was Annual Conference. It felt and was different this year, with the specter of all that is hanging over our head as a denomination as per our theological differences ie: the full inclusion of the LGBTQ community. We will talk more about this at a later time and in greater detail. I would urge you to go online to the New York Annual Conference website and click on the links for Annual Conference 19 to view videos of Conference. I would particularly recommend Bishop Bickerton's sermons and State of the Church address.

Finally, though I have been on leave, I have seen and had contact with many of you. Several of you invited me to lunch or dinner, and if it was a week I was around and we could work it out schedule wise, it was my privilege to join you. While in Maine, I spent time with Marti, Penny, and Hannah, who have a family home in the Boothbay region. I experienced all of these times as social, and we did not discuss church matters. I also attended two Finance meetings and a Trustee meeting, as they were at times I was around. All of this is a way of saying that though I personally and professionally benefitted from having a "time apart" from church responsibilities, I continued to enjoy seeing you when possible and have kept each of you in prayer.

Lastly, I am grateful to the team who kept things going while I was out. I especially thank Chris Russock, our Lay Leader, who I was in contact with as needed, and who did more behind the scenes these past few months than most people will ever know. I also thank leaders Peter Eaton, Dee Skidmore, Phyllis Tranzillo, and Tonya Clark, all of whom very skillfully kept things moving ahead in the administrative areas for which they have responsibility. Special thanks to our wonderful church administrator Patti Cohen-Hecht, with whom I also kept in touch as needed and who kept the office running with her usual competence and flair.

I am also grateful to all of you who continued to attend church regularly. I have heard that the guest preachers did very well, and I am not surprised, since they were all chosen carefully. Thank you for welcoming them.

I will look forward to seeing each of you this Sunday.




JOIN THE CRAFT GROUP
