Bishops to Appoint Commission to Re-evaluate Rules Regarding Sexuality Issues The Bishops council proposed that the conference defer all votes on sexuality measures; more than 100 such measures were sent to the 10-day meeting. The bishops proposed that they appoint a commission to undertake a "complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph in our Book of discipline regarding human sexuality".

The bishops' statement said that they heard from many members that the rules had language that was "contradictory, unnecessarily hurtful and inadequate" for a diverse and global church
